

## Knut Holter: Bio & publications

*Professor Knut Holter works at VID Specialized University in Stavanger, Norway (formerly known as School of Mission and Theology), partly in the Center for Mission and Global Studies and its PhD Program in theology and religious studies, and partly in the Faculty of Theology, Diaconia and Leadership Studies, where he teaches biblical studies. Holter holds a doctorate in Old Testament exegesis from the University of Oslo (1993), but has for the last 25 years mainly been doing research on African interpretive strategies vis-à-vis the Bible.*
